Laura Rombach, MA, LPCC, is a senior program therapist at the University of New Mexico. She currently coordinates and provides training in suicide prevention and behavioral health best practices throughout the state. She is the former project director for Addressing Childhood Trauma through Intervention Outreach and Networking (ACTION), a four-year SAMHSA grant at UNM. She is an independently licensed counselor with extensive experience in behavioral health program development, clinical services and childhood trauma and has worked in a variety of sites specializing in behavioral health care, family programs, adoption and foster care services, and youth residential settings.



Dr. Leah Bogusch is a descendant of the Spirit Lake Dakota Nation. She earned her PhD in Psychology in 2020. She is a psychology postdoctoral fellow at the Division of Community Behavioral Health at the University of New Mexico. In this position, she provides culturally-informed community mental health care for the Pueblo of San Felipe. This care includes individual therapy using therapies adapted for Native American populations and also includes regular consultation with community members who are members of the treatment team. Much of her clinical work centers on reduction of depressive symptoms and suicidality while also focusing on clients' areas of strength and resilience.
