## \$4,717,800 FY23 Executive Recommendation

\$762,000 Contractual Services +\$231.9k from FY22 \$684,700 To Support 8 New FTEs \$1,640,400 In Tribal Grants and Support

## The Executive Recommendation Includes:

\$1,488,600 more in General Fund than the LFC recommendation

More FTEs than the LFC recommendation

\$676,600 more in grants that benefit tribes than the LFC recommendation

The FY23 Executive Budget Recommendation allows IAD to further build programs in the following critical areas:

State Tribal Relations Strengthening our state and tribal partnerships, providing training and resources.	Public Safety and Justice Investing in the MMIWR Task Force and increasing capacity to address to epidemic of missing persons in our state.	Suicide Prevention Creating a position and program to assist tribal communities in preventing suicide in their communities.
Promote Healthy Communities Making investments to foster healthy native communities by developing tribal-specific response and solutions.	Investment in Tribal Infrastructure Building internal capacity to meet the needs of tribal communities in expending unprecedented investments in tribal infratructure.	Protecting Sacred Resources Supporting stronger protections for land, air, and water.
